Colour Code Classification

- Red (40-100) S the activity must be prohibited and Stopped immediately. Analyse alternative methods of conducting the activity safely.
- Orange (20-36) N the risk from the activity is Not adequately controlled and requires additional control measures to be introduced.
- Yellow (12-16) F the activity requires Further in-depth assessment to ascertain whether the risk is adequate or inadequately controlled.
- Green (8-10) A the risk from the activity is adequately controlled and can continue. Staff require to be informed of the risk.
- Blue (1-6) T the risk from the activity is deemed to be Trivial and can continue with no requirement for communication to staff.
