#### From Field to Fork (KS2)

**\* Please note that this is an example day and can be adapted to suit your class needs \***

- 10am** Arrive at Hasty's Adventure Farm. Welcome and Health & Safety talk. You will be shown to the Discovery Barn where belongings can be stored.
- 10.15am** **Activity 1: Animals and their habitats.**
  - \* Identify that animals need the right types and amount of nutrition and that they cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat.
  - \* Recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.
  - \* Describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals.
  - \* Recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents.
- 11.15am** Break / snack
- 11.30am** **Activity 2: Food production: grind wheat, identifying seeds, egg collecting, making butter.**
  - \* Understand seasonality and know where and how a variety of ingredients are grown, reared, caught and processed.
  - \* Use straightforward scientific evidence to answer questions or to support their findings.
  - \* Explain that some changes result in the formation of new materials and that this kind of change is not usually reversible.
  - \* Identify scientific evidence that has been used to support or refute ideas or arguments.
- 12.30pm** Lunch
- 1.15pm** **Activity 3: Making pancakes from farm produce!**
  - \* Explain that some changes result in the formation of new materials and that this kind of change is not usually reversible.
  - \* Observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled.
- 2pm** Depart Hasty's Adventure Farm .

### **Directions**

Hasty's Adventure Farm  
West Road, Clacton-on-Sea  
CO15 1AG

**By road:** From Colchester take the A120 to Clacton, then the A133 along St. John's Road. Go left at Jaywick Lane, and then left again along West Road. Hasty's is on the left hand side.

### **Opening times**

Hasty's Adventure Farm is open from 10am until 5pm, 7 days a week from April through to October. We currently close during winter months to develop Hasty's further and return the animals back to their home at the main farm.

### **Parking**

We have plenty of space for parking here at Hasty's Adventure Farm and it's completely free!
